



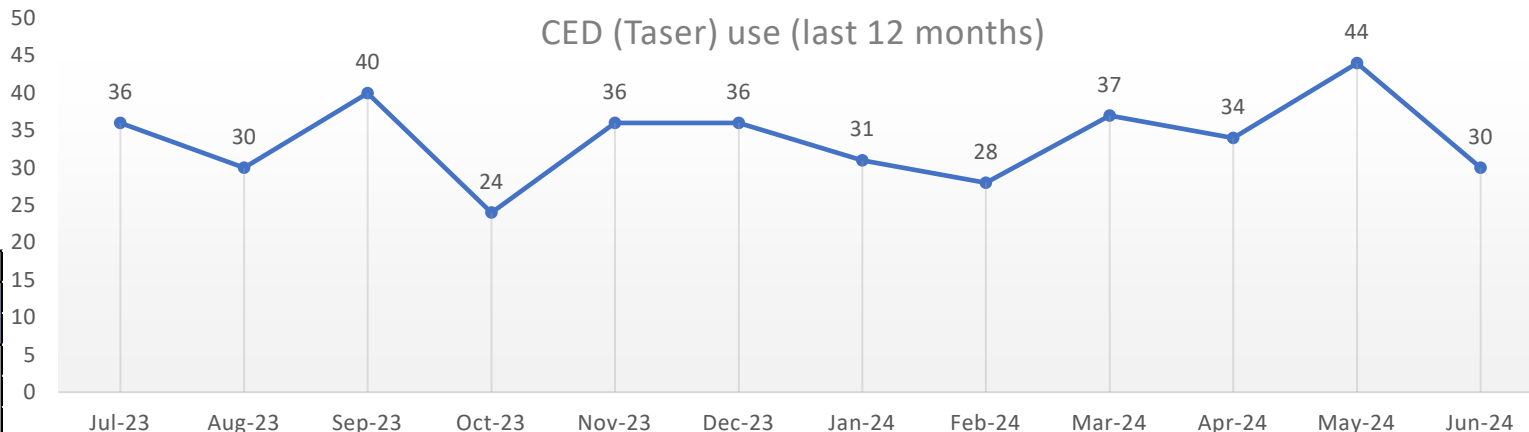

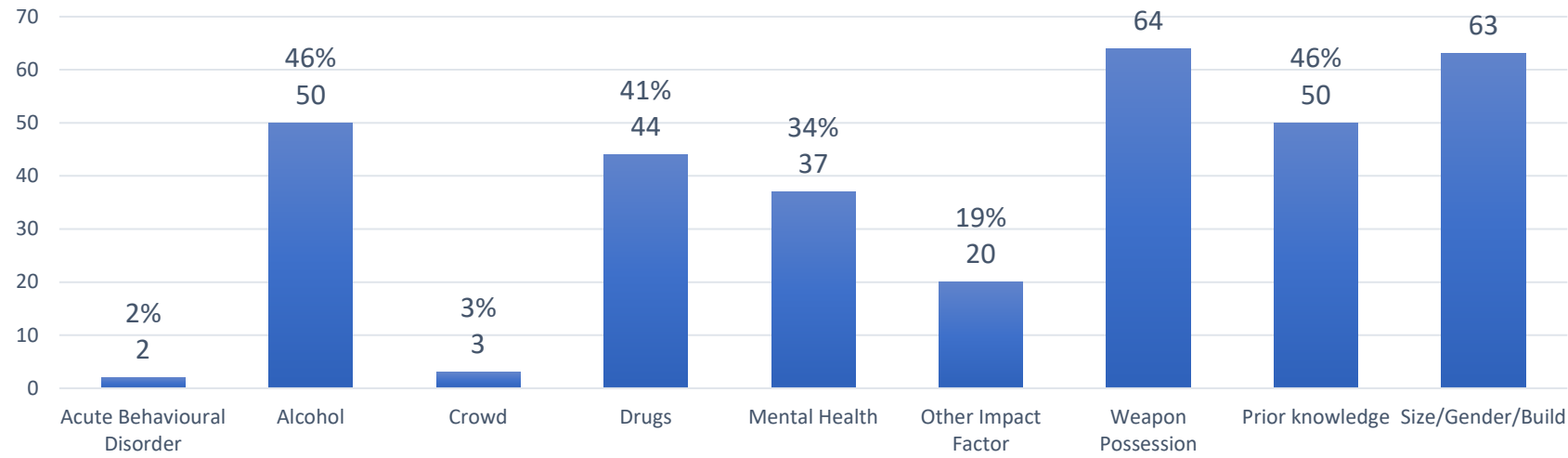

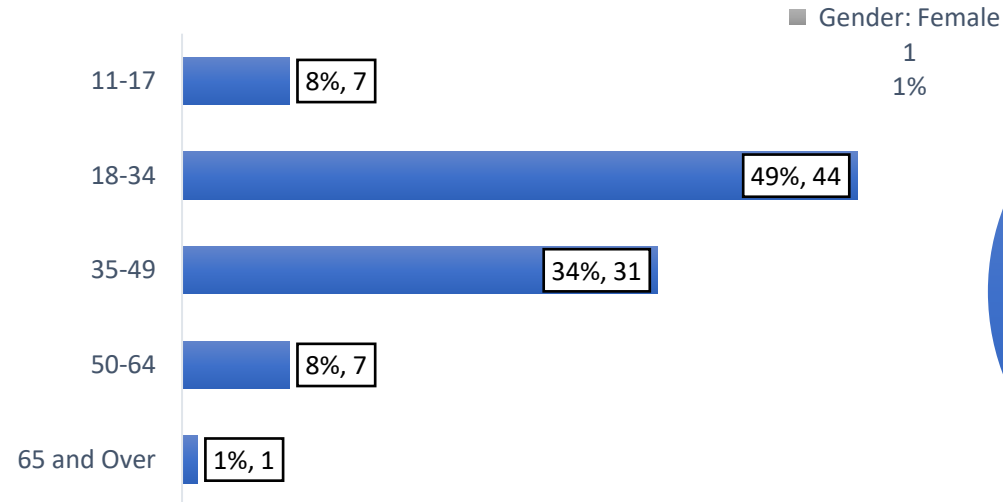

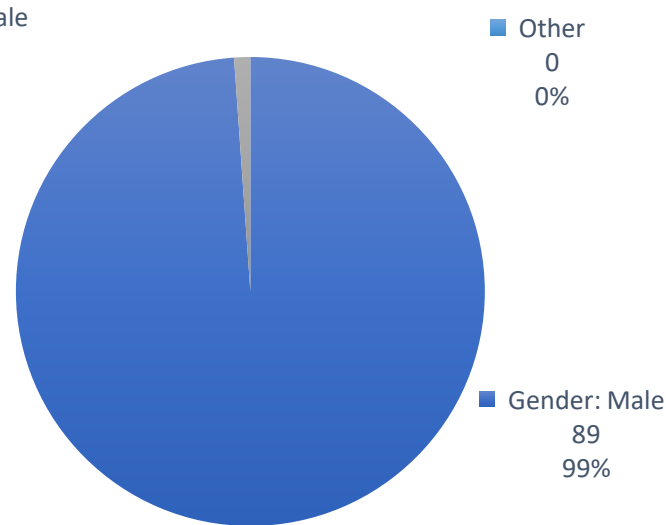

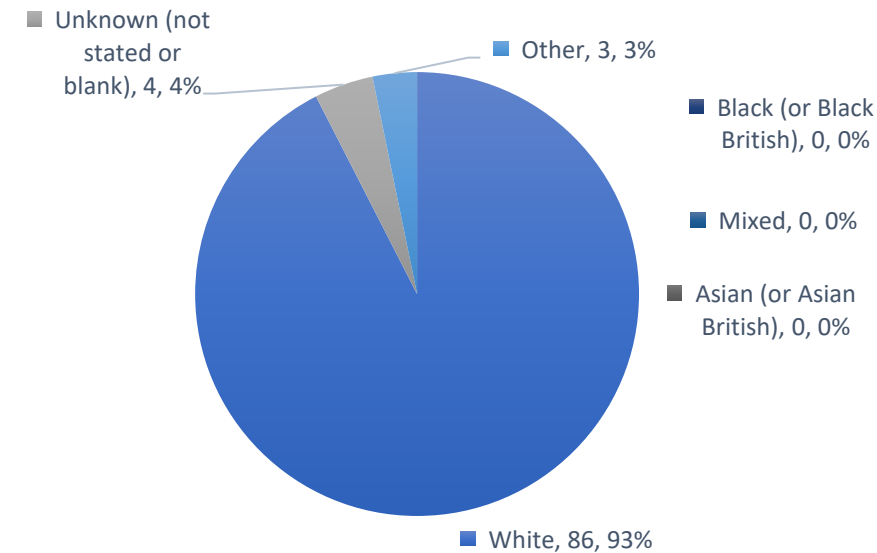
Age Group - Q1 2024/2025
